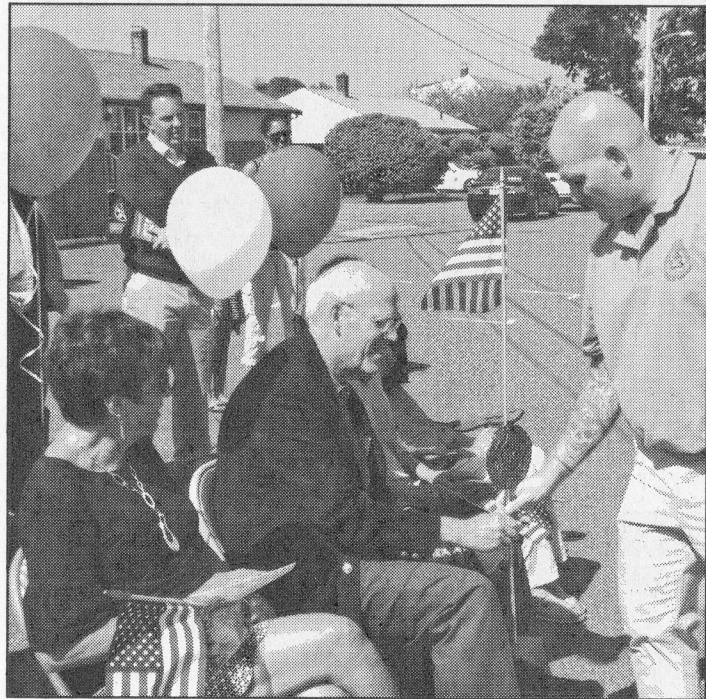


HONORING SERGEANT WILLIAM LANZA

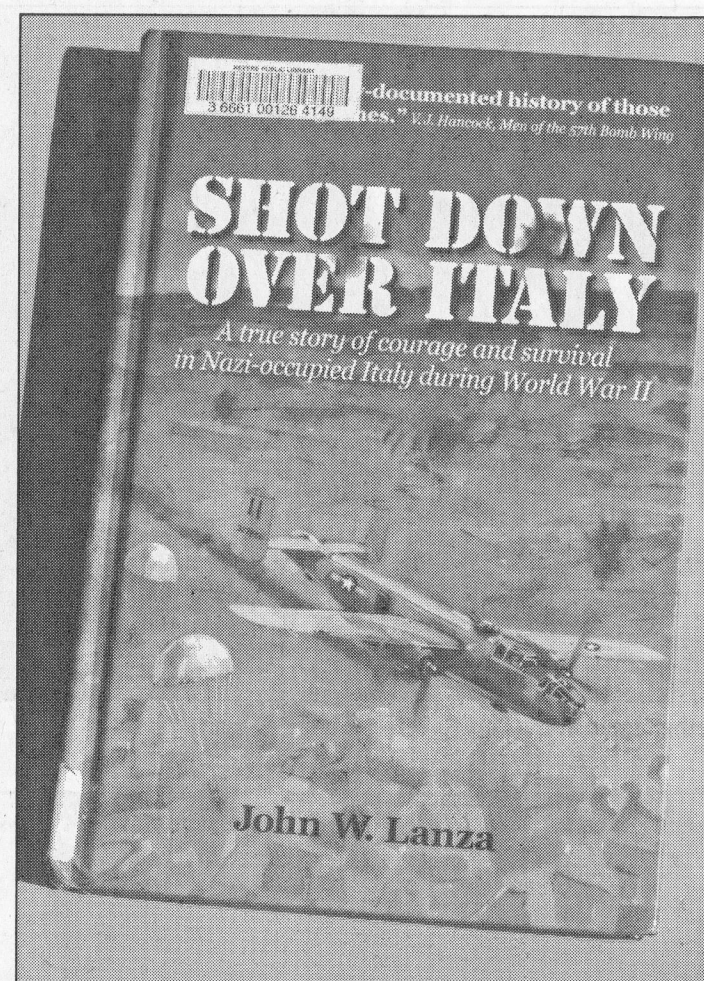

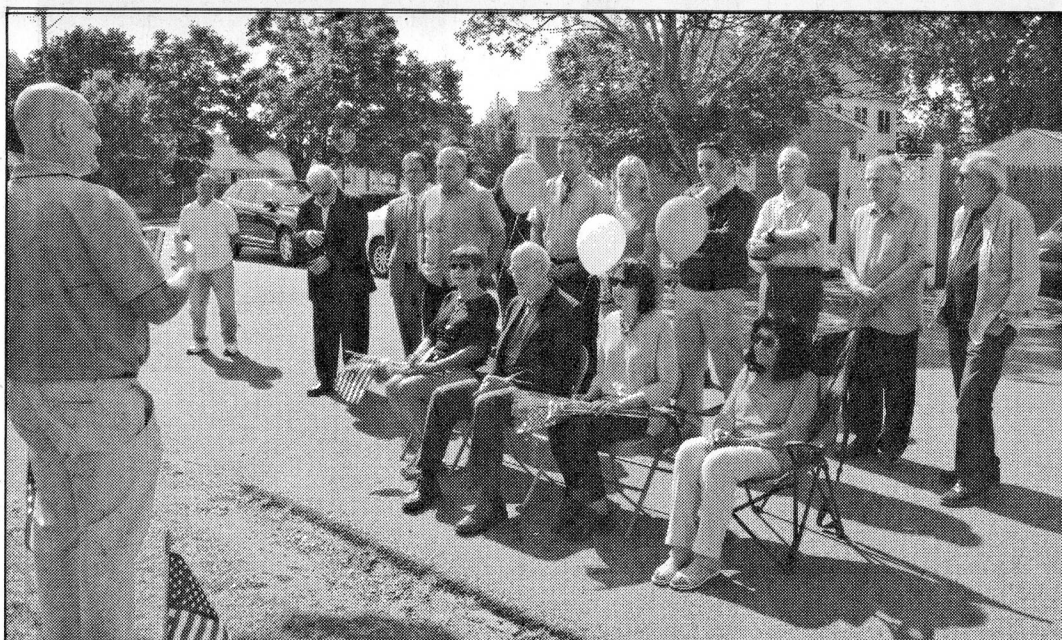
John W Lanza is presented a veterans flag holder by Director of Veterans services Marc Silvestri after the closing of the service.

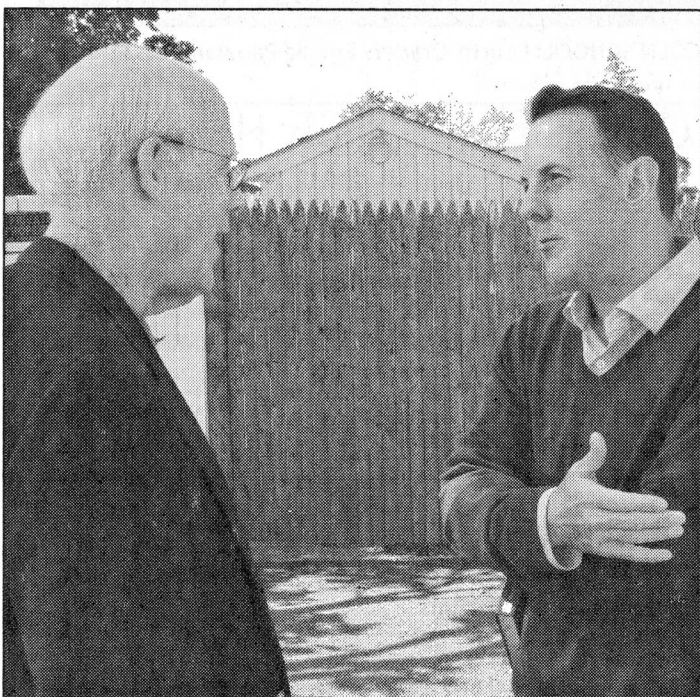
"Shot Down Over Italy," the story of Sergeant William Lanza's experience during WWII in occupied Italy, as told by William to his nephew, John W.
